


<u>Purím</u>

We 'used our brain' and cut up a picture of a brain and made a puzzle out of it and then put it back togerther.












Positive Mindset






In Art, we looked at the work of the Italian artist Guiseppe Archimboldo who pained portraits using fruit and vegetables.











Vear Two And Three Learning


Brainwave

















Land, Sea and Sky

This was our second unit for the term. We started this unit off with an exciting underwater adventure at Sea Life on the Sunshine Coast. To consolidate our learning about sea habitats, we researched underwater habitats and specific animals that are found in these habitats and then created a model habitat with an accompanying description of the learning that went into its development and creation. We also created model habitats and PowerPoint presentations to show our learning and understanding of land and sky habitats.

Some of our other learning throughout this unit included the many special adaptations animals need and have to survive in their different environments. What a food chain is, the flow of energy and the difference between producers and consumers. We also learnt how to classify animals into vertebrates and invertebrates and then further classify them into their subgroups. We investigated the different types of soil around our school and then matched up our findings with the different soil characteristics to decide which kind of soil each was as well as learning about why different soils are suited to different environments. The students have approached their learning with great enthusiasm throughout this entire unit and can be so proud of all the work that they

Penguins have thick layers of fat to keep them warm and their feathers are squished together tightly to keep them warm.


Penguins have webbed feet to be able to swim very fast in case another animal is trying to eat them.























Literature study




Senior Class Learning

The Senior class spent the first term learning about the brain, developing a positive mindset strategy wall and completing a unit on extinct and endangered animals.


The class was involved in several collaborative research projects learning about Australian animals. We also developed persuasive writing samples to help protect the rock wallaby.


To begin Term 2 we are looking at the First Fleet.































Term 2 - Music and Instrumental
