Every week, on Tuesday, we are going out on a journey of colours and shapes, learning about famous artists and practicing their techniques. We started this year with Picasso and the great Cubism movement. We learned about patterns and textures. Purim: For Purim we made colourful masks following IPC program. Each group learned a different technique according to the curriculum. We used the mask as a canvas. Prep and grade 1 prepared a Piccasso mask - a beautiful Cubism portrait. Grades 2 and 3 learned about Claude Monet's garden and accordingly created the mask as a beautiful garden, practicing the same colouring technique Claude Monet was using, little dots and many colours. With a lot of imagination and creativity Grades 4 and 5 turned their masks into growing tree's with roots and flowers. When Purim celebrations were over, we learned about a very interesting and colourful Canadian artist named Sandra Silberzweig. Her portraits inspired us and we learned how to draw a unique self-portrait using oil pastels on a white or black paper. Passover (which we also called the "Festival of Spring") is almost here and each one of us made a cheerful plate inspired by the spring in Israel. Using permanent markers and special glass paints, we learned how to draw a mandala on our plates.

Finding the Chametz

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Musíc

In music, Prep and Year One students explored the musical elements of pitch and rhythm. We started to classify high and low sounds and imitated noises of animals and objects. Students creatively brainstormed different sized animals ranging from large elephants to small birds. It was found that larger animals produced lower sounds and smaller animals made higher sounds. The students related that to how smaller instruments produce higher pitches compared to larger instruments. On the glockenspiel, we realised that the side with the longer bars made the lower pitches. Rhythm of notes and silences were discussed. Students used different percussion instruments to keep beat. Students also did plenty of singing. One song we learnt was "Over in the Meadow".

Year 2 and 3 students investigated how songs portray mood and atmosphere. We listened to songs in major and minor keys to interpret how emotions can be provoked by music. Students learnt rhythm names and how rhythms are written and represented on paper. We used YouTube to do some fun rhythm clap-alongs. Instruments of an orchestra and how they sounded was also a topic the students covered. We also had fun playing a few musical games.

The senior students learnt about elements of music including pitch, rhythm, timbre, mood dynamics and articulation. Students noticed the patterns in melody during a song and how composers make it catchy. The seniors consolidated their knowledge from previous musical training and applied themselves to more complex rhythms and longer exercises. Using different percussion instruments, students made up rhythmic ostinatos to perform for their peers. We deepened our understanding of the expressive characteristics in compositions such as dynamics and articulation. Students explored orchestral instruments and each instrument's unique timbre. We also did some ear training differentiating between major and minor chords.







Prep and Year One IPC. Who am I?

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The way we feel and the way we are 'Ourselves' is a wonderful theme at any age, but with children of 5-7 it is especially exciting because they are at a stage in their lives when they are just beginning to feel 'grown up' as they learn important adult skills such as reading, writing and mathematics. They are also finding out the skills they need to be part of a group and are moving away from the selfcentred picture of themselves that dominates the first few years of their life to a realisation that their 'self' is not just about them but is also defined by their relationships with others. Above all, we should celebrate our differences whilst seeing our similarities to our group members. So, we are individuals as well as important members of a wider community.

We learnt about our families, where our parents were born and where we were born. We discussed the things that make us happy and how to deal with anger. We traced around our bodies and learnt how our hearts work, as well as different kinds of healthy and not so healthy food types. We discovered which activities we can do well and how we can stay fit and strong. We explored basic map work and learnt about Australia and how to find our local area on a map of Brisbane. In Art we drew portraits and completed the 'other half' of a photograph of our face. At the end of this unit, we had a better understanding of who we are, what our strengths are, how we can make better choices and to have self- respect and to respect others. Term One has been filled with much excitement and wonderful learning.







Year Two and Three IPC. Bienvenue en France.

On our brief journey across France this term we have learnt many exciting and informative things. In World Language and Cultural Awareness, we explored the French language, and listened, spoke, and wrote in French. We can greet and introduce ourselves in French, count to twenty, say the names of the colours, the days of week and the months of the year. Learning about French food made us very hungry! In Technology we learned about cog mechanisms related to the Canal du Midi. We created our very own mini city of Paris after learning about famous landmarks in this wonderful city. In Art we learned about Claude Monet, a prominent French artist, whose artistic style was then used as inspiration for our Purim masks. After learning about the Eifel Tower, we drew it and produced great pieces of art. We developed our researching skills when we completed our 'France Snapshot Activity'. We worked in pairs and refined our questioning and internet searching abilities. One of the things that featured prominently in our research was the Tour de France, we spent time exploring the race in more detail. Following this we briefly learnt about the French Revolution, with our focus being on Bastille day, understanding why and how it is celebrated. We have had a fantastic term of learning!





Year Four, Five and Six IPC. Roots, Shoots and Fruits.

Over the last few weeks those of us in Year 4, 5 and 6 have been working on the IPC that focuses on plants. In Science, we learnt about which plants grow in our local area, how to sort and group plants, what the parts of a plant are, the function of roots and what plants need in order to grow. To assist in our learning, we built some great greenhouses and watched our Cress seeds grow. We also planted some flowers and seeds into pots and have been nurturing them all term. In Geography, we researched about the tallest plants in the world and why we need to save the rainforest. We have learnt some valuable lessons about our tress and how important it is to protect them from destruction. It was great to see how well Tu B'Shvat tied in with our IPC unit as the planting of the tree at the beginning of the term was a perfect starting point for our class.
